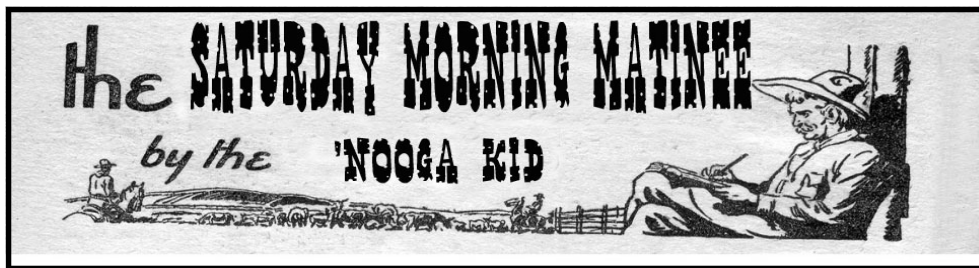

Pards

Cowboy movies, cowboy TV shows and Cowboy Action Shooting all go together. For many of us, those days as kids, sittin' in the front row of the Saturday Morning Matinee watching our heroes round up the bad guys is being relived every time we strap on our six shooters and head out to the range.

One of those western heroes that was always one of the top shows on radio, movies and TV was "The Lone Ranger".

Created by Fran Striker for a Chicago radio station in 1933, the show was almost an instant success. In 1938, Republic Pictures bought the rights to produce a 15 chapter serial. These were the cliffhangers shown in 15 to 20 minute episodes each week to entice young movie goers to "Be Back Again Next Week". In the original serial, there were actually five "Lone Rangers". As one would be killed, another would take his place until the last one, played by Lee Powell, beat the bad guys.

This was followed in 1939 with "The Lone Ranger



Rides Again" with Robert Livingston playing the lead.

In both serials, Victor Daniels (AKA, Chief Thundercloud) played his pal Tonto.

From 1938 to 1944, The Lone Ranger appeared in newspaper comic strips.

It wasn't until 1949 that the Lone Ranger appeared again, this time on that new fangled Television. Clayton Moore, a character actor that normally played a B movie bad guy was chosen for the lead. Clayton had been a trapeze performer and was powerfully built. His voice

was strong and unique. Tonto was played by actor Howard J. Smith, (AKA, Jay Sliverheels)



In 1952, George Trendle, the producer of The Lone Ranger, called Moore into his office and announced he was bring in another actor to assume the role, so for the next 39 episodes, actor John Hart donned the black mask with Tonto (Sliverheels) at his side. There was so much uproar, that Trendle brought Moore back the next season where he stayed until the series was over in 1957.

Beginning in 1948, Lone Ranger comic books began and lasted for 145 issues.

Clayton and Jay also filmed two Lone Ranger movies, “The Lone Range” in 1956 and “The Lone Ranger and the City of Gold” in 1958.

A film was made in 1978, “The Legend of the Lone Ranger” with an unknown actor named Klinton Spillsbury in the lead. It was terrible and fortunately Spillsbury never made another film.

A lot of talk has been going on for a new Lone Ranger film with Johnny Depp as Tonto. Thank God that project has been cancelled for now due to budget overruns. Let’s hope it stays cancelled until Hollywood learns how to make Westerns again. (plus, I just can’t imagine Johnny Depp as Tonto!)
